Who you can speak to

Your Midwife

Your midwife can give breastfeeding support while you are pregnant and after your baby is born. They can help you with a breastfeeding plan and help you find extra support.

Your Children's Public Health 0-19 Nursing Service

Nutrition Peer Support Workers and Health Visitors provide free one-to-one breastfeeding peer support and community breastfeeding groups in Nottingham. They can give breastfeeding support over the phone, video or face-to-face depending on your need.
